#### MEMORY VERSE

LUKE 24:27

And beginning at Moses and all the Prophets, He expounded to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself.

#### WHAT YOU WILL NEED:

As many 8.5"x11" pieces of paper as the number of children in your class, stickers and crayons, or markers.

Several 8.5"x11" matching cards with prophecies concerning the Messiah.

Fruit like bananas, grapes, and pineapple chunks, paper or Styrofoam cups, tongs or a spoon, and forks.

#### ATTENTION GRABBER!

#### What Is Encouragement?

Have your children make a card with an encouraging note or happy picture (according to age appropriateness). Fold an 8.5"x11" paper in half for each card. Have your children use stickers and markers or crayons to produce their encouraging cards.

Give the cards to an outreach ministry in your church and have the cards distributed to nursing home residents, shut-ins, or hospital patients.

Explain to your class the meaning of encouragement and how We can find encouragement in the promises of God's word.

#### **LESSON TIME!**

All of us can relate to the two individuals in our lesson today, because, at some point in our life, we have all experienced some time of discouragement. The Lord knows we need encouragement. In our lesson today, we will see Jesus giving encouragement to two of His disciples through the promises of God's word. We can find encouragement in the promises of God's word.

#### LUKE 24:13-16

Now behold, two of them were traveling that same day to a village called Emmaus, which was about seven miles from Jerusalem.

And they talked together of all these things which had happened.

So it was, while they conversed and reasoned, that Jesus Himself drew near and went with them.

But their eyes were restrained, so that they did not know Him.

This was Resurrection Day, the day we celebrate Jesus rising from the dead to give us a future of hope and life for eternity. Because of the resurrection, we know that death has been conquered and we will be raised from the dead to live forever with Christ. The resurrection was the greatest event in the history of mankind.

Though this day should have been a day of celebration, the two men walking from Jerusalem to Emmaus were discouraged disciples who had no reason to be discouraged. They had heard of the women's reports that the tomb of Jesus was empty and that He was alive, but they would not believe them.

Disappointment filled their hearts with despair, since they had thought Jesus would redeem Israel. They saw the glory of the kingdom, but they failed to understand the suffering that Jesus had to go through. These men didn't understand what God said in His word about His plan and His promises. Their world had crumbled around them and they needed encouragement. We can find encouragement in the promises of God's word.

#### LUKE 24:17-24

And He said to them, "What kind of conversation is this that you have with one another as you walk and are sad?"

Then the one whose name was Cleopas answered and said to Him, "Are You the only stranger in Jerusalem, and have You not known the things which happened there in these days?"

And He said to them, "What things?" So they said to Him, "The things concerning Jesus of Nazareth, who was a Prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people,

and how the chief priests and our rulers delivered Him to be condemned to death, and crucified Him.

But we were hoping that it was He who was going to redeem Israel. Indeed, besides all this, today is the third day since these things happened.

Yes, and certain women of our company, who arrived at the tomb early, astonished us.

When they did not find His body, they came saying that they had also seen a vision of angels who said He was alive.

And certain of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said; but Him they did not see."

What a beautiful picture of how Jesus comforts us in our time of distress. These two disciples had all the evidence they needed to believe that He rose from the dead, but they walked in unbelief. Their real problem was not in their heads, but in their hearts. They needed a fresh understanding of the word of God, and Jesus gave that understanding to them. We can find encouragement in the promises of God's word. We can put our confidence and hope in the promises of God's word because He is able to complete it.

The disciples from Emmaus were counting on Jesus to rescue Israel. Most Jews believed that the Old Testament prophecies pointed to a military and political Messiah. They believed that the Messiah would come to rule and reign at that time. They didn't realize that the Messiah had come to rescue people's souls. When Jesus died, they lost hope. They didn't understand that Jesus' death offered the greatest hope available.

LUKE 24:25-27

Then He said to them, "O foolish ones, and slow of heart to believe in all that the prophets have spoken!

Ought not the Christ to have suffered these things and to enter into His glory?"

And beginning at Moses and all the Prophets, He expounded to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself.

# Prophecy Matching Game

Prior to class, make several cards on 8.5"x11" pieces of paper with prophecies concerning the Messiah. Make sure you make two of each prophecy so each has a match.

Lay these cards face down on the ground and play a matching game with your class. Each child may take a turn at turning over two cards. If they match, they may keep the cards and take another turn. If they don't match, the next child may have a turn.

The child with the most pairs at the end of the game is the winner. This child can be rewarded by being given the privilege of passing out the snack for the class.

Why did Jesus call these men foolish? Cleopas and his companion failed to believe and understand all that the prophets had written about the Messiah's suffering. That was the problem with most of the Jews of that day. They saw Messiah as a conquering Redeemer, but they didn't see Him as a suffering servant.

God promised us salvation through the suffering and death of His Son. God's offer of salvation will never disappoint us. Jesus will never let us down. Because He now lives, we may be encouraged, never disappointed, to know that everyone who believes in Him will be saved (Romans 10:10-11).

After the two disciples expressed their discouragement in what had happened, Jesus lovingly answered them by going to the scripture and applying it to His ministry. They needed the encouragement of God's word. When we are discouraged or puzzled by questions or problems, we can find encouragement in the promises of God's word. Romans 15:4 tells us, "For whatever was written in earlier times were written for our instruction, that through perseverance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope."

#### LUKE 24:28-31

Then they drew near to the village where they were going, and He indicated that He would have gone farther.

But they constrained Him, saying, "Abide with us, for it is toward evening, and the day is far spent." And He went in to stay with them.

Now it came to pass, as He sat at the table with them, that He took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them.

Then their eyes were opened and they knew Him; and He vanished from their sight.

As Jesus began to walk away, the disciples asked Him to come home with them. They had been encouraged by the word of God and desired for the blessing to last. The more we receive the word of God, the more we want the fellowship of the word of God. Jesus opened the Scriptures to them and then He opened their eyes so that they recognized Him. Now they knew for themselves that He was alive.

#### LUKE 24:32-35

And they said to one another, "Did not our heart burn within us while He talked with us on the road, and while He opened the Scriptures to us?"

So they rose up that very hour and returned to Jerusalem, and found the eleven and those who were with them gathered together,

saying, "The Lord is risen indeed, and has appeared to Simon!"

And they told about the things that had happened on the road, and how He was known to them in the breaking of bread.

Vanishing from their sight, Jesus left them with the comfort of knowing that He was alive and that God's word was true. Jesus had made things very plain and clear to them; a divine heat and a divine light burned in their souls. Their hearts burned within, kindled with a holy fire of faith towards their Savior, Jesus.

God's word can warm our hearts with the peace of His promises. It both instructs and comforts us, giving us a holy desire and devotion within our heart to worship Him. We can find encouragement in the promises of God's word.

The disciples were so excited and overwhelmed with joy that they made their way back to Jerusalem that very hour. They had seen Jesus, and God's promises were true. There was no time to waste; they couldn't wait to tell their friends what had happened.

Has Jesus made a difference in your life? These two men were changed and they wanted others to experience the same hope and joy which is found through Jesus and His word.

Many people around us live a life without hope, filled with discouragement. Jesus can make the life-changing difference, but we need to tell them. Jesus is alive, and we can trust in His promises. We can find encouragement in the promises of God's word.

# "Encouragement" for the Body

Have your children help you prepare fruit cups for the class snacktime. While preparing your snack, explain how our bodies need nourishment to grow and live and be healthy, just like our spirits need encouragement from God's word. Wash the fruit thoroughly. Cut bananas, remove grapes from bunches, and have the children use tongs or spoons to fill Styrofoam cups with the fruit snack.

#### **PRAYER**

Lead the children in a prayer of thanksgiving for the promises of God's word. If there are any children who have not yet responded to the gospel, give them an opportunity to do so.







# Dear Parents...

Welcome to <u>Bible Time for Kids</u>. <u>Bible Time for Kids</u> is a series of daily devotions for children and their families. Our purpose is to supplement our Sunday morning curriculum and give you an opportunity to encourage your children to develop a daily devotional life. We hope you and your family will e blessed as you study God's Word together.

This week in Children's Church we learned about **The Road to Emmaus**. The theme was "**We can find encouragement in the promises of God's word**." It's so easy to get discouraged when you see what is in this world apart from God. It's refreshing and encouraging knowing that God's promises are fulfilled.

For children life can sometimes be challenging. There are a lot of things in this world that can tempt them to do wrong things. As parents, we can let them see the encouragement in our life that we have received from God's word. Children "catch" more from their parents than they are "taught". Let them "catch" encouragement from you.

The section of scripture that we studied was **Luke 24:13-35**. The following five devotions are based on either the scripture and/or the theme for Sunday's lesson. As a starting point it would be good for you to review these verses with your children.

These devotions are designed to help you reinforce Sunday's lesson throughout the week with your children, provide some more ideas for the application of God's Word in your children's lives and provide a tool to help in family devotions.

Obviously children at various age levels will respond to the devotional in different ways. You may want to add your own ideas to these to make them more age appropriate.

May the Lord bless you as you study His Word together!

# "Where's Your Focus?"

**Text:** Luke 24:16 - "But their eyes were restrained, so they did not know Him."

Also read John 20:14 and John 21:4

Cleopas and his friend were leaving Jerusalem on their way to Emmaus. "Hey Cleopas, did you hear that Jesus' tomb is empty and He is still alive?" Cleopas' friend had heard the report from the women that Jesus' tomb was empty and that He was indeed alive. "Yes, I've heard, but I don't believe it's true," claimed Cleopas. "I am just so disappointed that Jesus' had to die. He was the only one who could rescue Israel. We're doomed!" cried Cleopas. As the two men were walking Jesus drew near and went with them. But they were so focused on their disappointment that they did not know that Jesus was with them.

Unfortunately, the two men were so focused on the future of the nation of Israel that they didn't understand about Jesus' suffering. They knew the Bible really well and they tried to remember what Jesus had taught them, but they were unable to put it all together. It just didn't seem to make sense. What more proof did they need? The tomb was empty, witnesses saw Him alive and heard Him speak, and angels said Jesus was alive. They just didn't understand the word of God. Sometimes we can read the promises of God, but not understand what they mean for us. There are many promises God has made to us. He has not broken a single promise. What Cleopas and his friend didn't understand was that God promised us that He would send His son to die on the cross for our sins and that He would rise again from the dead.

We can see from the experience of these two men that they were very discouraged and disappointed. They were bummed out because things didn't go the way THEY thought they should. But things did go exactly as God planned. They didn't find encouragement in God's promises because they focused on their own understanding of things and not God's. His word is full of His promises. He has never failed to fulfill a promise and He never will. Sometimes we can get a little down when things don't go the way we think they should. Let's remember that we can find encouragement in the promises of God's Word.

# The Unbreakable Promise

**Text:** John 3:16 - "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life."

Also read John 17:2,3

What does it mean to you when someone says, "I promise?" You probably take that person's word that they will do whatever they are promising. When you make a promise to someone, they trust you with all their heart. If you break that promise to them then you have let them down very badly, they may not be able to trust you any more. Once a promise has been made, it is VERY important to keep. Have you ever made a promise that you didn't keep? Maybe you forgot about the promise or you were sick so you were not able to fulfill the promise.

What's so wonderful about the promises that God gives us is that they will never be broken. Maybe others have broken their promises to us or we have let other people down at some time. But we can trust in God and never have to worry about an excuse for why the promise was broken. In God's word there are so many promises. My favorite promise from God is found in John 3:16. God sent His Son Jesus Christ to die on the cross for my sins. When I accepted Jesus into my heart, I have the promise of everlasting life with God. Why do I believe this? If I believe in Jesus, God promises that I will live forever with Him. God has never broken a promise. He can't. He's perfect!

It can be very difficult sometimes to keep a promise. We can be tempted by the devil to break the promise. If you make a promise to someone, try really hard not to break it. Ask the Lord to give you strength to keep your word. He is very strong and we can receive strength from Him. A good verse to remember is "I can do ALL things through Christ who strengthens me" (Philippians 4:13). With God's promises we can find encouragement. Over the next few days we will look at different promises God gives us through His word. We can find encouragement in our relationship with Him by learning these promises.

# Power to Overcome

**Text:** Philippians 4:13 - "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me."

Also read 1 Peter 1:6-8

This week in our devotions we have learned a lot about God's promises. We have learned about discouragement and how to find encouragement. We have seen that when we are sad we can always bring our problems to the Lord. We can find encouragement for ourselves and we can encourage others through our example, by pointing others to Jesus, and by telling others about God's promises. We have read about the two men who were very discouraged because they didn't believe that Jesus was raised from the dead. They were hoping that Jesus was going to save Israel and since He was crucified they believed that everything was done, all hope was gone. When Jesus met up with them on the road to Emmaus He opened their eyes by opening their hearts to God's word. Then they understood.

Jesus is alive and He still opens hearts through His word. That's encouraging! God promised that His son Jesus would give us salvation. God fulfilled His promise by sending His only Son (John 3:16). The next time that you find yourself sad or discouraged just look in God's word to find comfort and help. If you need help, just ask your parents or your teacher at Children's Church.

In the story we looked at this week about John and his discouragement with his friends we see that John gave his burden to Jesus. When we face difficult times we have the power to overcome through God's word. You can find many promises that God gives us through His word. I have listed a few promises here. You can add to the list.

The promise of eternal life - John 17:2,3

The promise of the Holy Spirit - Luke 24:29, John 14:16,17,26; Acts 1:4; 2:38,39

The promise of access to God - Romans 5:2

The promise of growth in Christ - 2 Corinthians 3:18
